

FEBRUARY SCRIPTURES

In the Sundays following Epiphany and continuing up to the start of Lent, the Old Testament readings are closely related to the Gospel. We hear from Matthew, with a sprinkling from John, about the early events of Jesus' ministry, including the opening sections of the Sermon on the Mount. In the Old Testament, it's some of the Hebrew prophets like Isaiah or Micah who are called upon to shed light on Jesus' preaching about life in the kingdom of God. Meanwhile, the New Testament readings take us into what is arguably the most beloved of Paul's letters, I Corinthians.

Reading the Scripture passages during the week is a good way to prepare for the worship of God. Our weekly Wednesday Nite Bible Study provides an opportunity to do that with others. Every Sunday, as one passage is set beside another, new insights emerge from the dialogue between them.





Approval of the 2014 budget.

Approval of recommendations to the congregation about pastoral terms of call and further recommendation about dissolving the pastoral relationship between TPC and Marney. Not fun.

Approval of the dates for communion in 2014. That the Long Range Development discussed the newest development plans and expects the pro forma numbers anytime soon.

Approval of a pilot program that allows the Aussie Cantina food truck to serve a meal to the homeless once a month in the TPC parking lot.


