PASTORAL LETTER & WORSHIP

A Rowboat or a Sailboat?



Be filled with the Spirit. Ephesians 5:18

When the early church pictured itself as a boat, it was always a sailboat and never a rowboat.

A row boat is us doing all the work. Everything

depends on us, our strength, our sweat, our effort, our limitations. The rowboat can only go so far and fast as we can make it go. And we determine the direction—sort of. If we get lost out on the sea, we're lost at sea. When our store of food and water runs out. we die.

A sailboat is powered by the wind. In the Aug 24 case of the church, the wind is the Spirit that not only powers us and propels us through the waves, but also carries us where it chooses to God's good harbor.

Rowboat churches ask. "What are our resources?" and "What can we do with what we have?"

Sailboat churches ask, "What is God calling us to do together?" and asks "How is God going to provide what we need to do, what he wants us to do?"

Rowboat churches are at the mercy of the waves, and the limits of themselves. flounder.

Sailboat churches are master of the waves, because they know the Master of the Ship is at the helm.



SESSION NOTES

Session Notes for June and July 2014

Session mourns the loss of our sister ruling elder Terry Dalke. As chair of the Mission Committee Terry was vital to our church life. Terry's giving spirit and her dedication to encourage all of us to participate in the missional work of Trinity was admirable. Other elders – Bobby Whipple, Carroll Keegstra and Carolyn Maycher have stepped up to attempt to fill Terry's shoes as Mission Committee chair. The legacy continues.

Most committees are working in low gear during the summer months. Routine business such as approving the Corporate Resolution, a baptism and Lynn Moser's vacation time occupied Session during June. The deacons readjusted after the resignation of Michelle Valaskova. Growth & Outreach is working on new signage and banners. The Long Range Development Team continues to monitor the progress of the development group. Stewardship & Finance approved some camp scholarships and is reviewing the costs of the office expenses with the credit card machine, the copier and the postage meter.

As always, Session prayed for various members of the congregation. And Session engaged in a preliminary discussion about the Appreciative Inquiry material that the Rev. Jerry Foust, our Temporary Pastor, sent along before his arrival.

In July, Session met at the home of John Hill for a salad supper, sun gazing, sunset enjoyment and meeting Jerry Foust. Bobby Whipple had conjured some questions much like those asked during the interviews on Actors Studio. We put Jerry in the "not so hot seat" and he gave some thought-provoking and entertaining answers.

In a short Called meeting Session made a few decisions. Session approved Administration & Personal's request to increase the compensation package for Jerry Foust to add Supplemental Life Insurance from the Board of Pensions of the Presbyterian Church, correcting an earlier oversight. Also, Session approved a three-year lease agreement with the Center of English as a Second Language Department (CESL) of the University of Arizona to use six classrooms and one office in our Mission Cen-

ter. The lease includes a 90-day out clause in case we need the CESL to vacate. Our Paulus, Dorman, Bourn Development Group blesses this arrangement as they continue to surmount the hurdles for development of our property.

Lastly, Session approved allowing the Trinity Presbyterian Women to collect shoes and socks for foster children. You will be hearing more about this project.

Emily Sophia Koop was baptized on June 6 in the Trinity sanctuary. Dave & Jen Koop are her parents.




