

SESSION NOTES

Session Notes for August 2014

The Rev. Jerry Foust moderated our August Stated Session meeting – his first stated meeting at Trinity PC. Session spent their Leading Together time mourning the death of his wife Melynda and learning about what we can expect from Jerry and what he expects of the church leadership during our time in transition. With a little humor, some devotional moments and a little contemplation we learned that this interim time is to be an active time of study and discernment. Jerry gave the elders an overview of the tasks of an interim pastor along with some study material. Now is the time to make a strategic pause as we redefine our roles in life together.

Session accepted with regret the resignation of Dave Koop as a Trinity ruling elder after his family's move to Dartmouth, MA. Session approved Rona Kreamer joining the Growth & Outreach Team as a member-at-large. Also, Session approved the Growth & Outreach proposal to sell T-shirts, polo shirts and tote bags with the Trinity logo. Look for order forms in this VISION newsletter.

No other committees had actions for session decisions. Christian Education is planning Rally Sunday and the WNA! kick off as seen elsewhere in the VISION. The Deacons continue to minister to TPC congregants and have determined that, at this time, we have seven homebound members. The Deacons are planning the November 8, 2014 church picnic at Reid Park. Administration & Personnel announced that Peter Holbrook is assuming the custodial duties for the U of A Center for English as a Second Language (CESL) classrooms in the Mission Center. Over 500 students and 100 teachers are expected to be seen on the Trinity campus – luckily, not all at the same time!

Property Committee worked hard to spruce up the CESL classrooms and office as well as replace three HVAC (air conditioners). Mission Committee is planning Christmas season events and Stewardship and Finance Committee is working on the fall stewardship campaign. This committee is pleased that a new photocopier and new postage meter should represent a 50% to 60% savings. Also, by the end of July 2014 the Trinity budget shortfall was only \$1,244.64.

Session prayed for our congregation, for Jerry and Melynda Foust's family, for new beginnings and for peace in this troubled world.


